Our sustainability actions are student led. This particular initiative was suggested by a group of Year 8 students that were interested in reducing our plastic use and wanted to participate in Plastic Free July. It aligned with our broader efforts to improve our waste management. Our aim was simply to raise awareness about the impacts of plastic and to encourage our community to lessen their own impact.



ACTION

- How was the project delivered?

We are in lockdown in Sydney so we had to be creative. We decided to do the following:

- Shared videos about the impacts of plastics and what we can do about it
- Created a survey to gather information about plastic use
- Asked our students, staff and parents to make a pledge to reduce their plastic use (we had over 250 responses)
- We provided resources to teachers to facilitate lessons from our youngest students in Early Learning to our oldest HSC students.
- Conversations about plastic occurred across the school in Early Learning, Primary and High School
- Students were invited to create posters to promote reduced plastic use
- Finally, we wrote an article in our school newsletter















STUDENT LEADERSHIP

We have a 'Sustainable Futures' student group that regularly meets to discuss and plan initiatives. Students drive the agenda and hold leadership roles in our key focus areas (waste, energy, biodiversity, resources, water and activism). Students love being part of Sustainable Futures because there are genuine leadership opportunities and we get things done!
